
EDDIE MILLER

In the 8th grade, Eddie earned a spot on the Curry High School football team. He continued to play football as well as basketball, baseball, and track, lettering in all four sports. He was on Curry's first winning football team and he was Curry's first all-state player, earning this honor as a guard in 1963.



After high school, Eddie turned his attention to basketball officiating which resulted in a long, rewarding career. He officiated for 40 years beginning with intramural basketball at Walker College and ending with NCAA basketball. He officiated in 16 college leagues working 21 years in the SEC. Some of his achievements include: 21 NCAA tournaments on both the men's and women's side; 2 NIT championship games; 2 final four games. He also worked the tournament championship game in the SEC, Big 12, Southwest Conference, Metro, Conference USA, Ohio Valley, Gulf South, and AL Jr. College. Eddie also worked two AHSAA State Championship games. After retirement, he worked as a regional observer of officials for the SEC.
